### STAFFING UPDATE

As I am sure you will be aware from recent news coverage, there has been an announcement recently by Glasgow City Council that education is no longer protected from spending cuts. The council requires to make significant savings to its education spend and has announced a 3- year savings programme.

Here are the savings that require to be made over next 3 years:

- 2024 2025 £6, 741, 00 primary teacher numbers being reduced
- 2025 2026 £9, 045, 000 support worker allocation reconfigured
- 2026 2027 £12, 022, 500 management structures

In the first year, primary teachers are being reduced across the city, with the loss of approximately 170 primary teachers across Glasgow. This announcement came after the staffing exercise had already been carried out by Glasgow and reductions communicated. In total we will be 2 teachers less next session. This will impact significantly on how we as a school support pupil need and the wider activities we will be able to provide next session.

At the moment we have a wide range of pupil support provided by our management team in addition to our core staff. With these cuts many of the management team may end up class committed which would mean they are not able to continue with the pupil supports, family learning, arrangement of wider opportunities and experiences that we offer across the school.

We currently also provide additional targeted support with learning for children who need this at points throughout their school life. This will not be able to continue to the same extent next session due to these cuts.

As you can see with the further proposed cuts in the following 2 sessions this again will have a massive impact on our ability to support pupil need and to continue to raise attainment and achievement.

This is also affecting our current classification and will result in there being more composite classes across the school for next session. All classes are technically composite classes as children are taught as per their ability level in literacy and numeracy. A composite class is made up of more than one stage for example P2/3. If your child is allocated to a composite class their ability levels will be catered for irrespective of what stage they are in. There are many benefits of composite classes, one in particular is the small class size which cannot exceed 25 pupils.

The Parent Council have been updated on the situation and will be contacting local councillors to express concerns with regard to the situation and the detrimental outcomes for our pupils. All families can contact the local councillors to express concerns with regard to these cuts and how this will affect the additional provisions that our pupils receive.

We would welcome your support with this.

We look forward to welcoming our new P1 pupils for their visits to Sandwood Primary this term and will hold our first induction day for our P1 August intake on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> May 1.30pm- 2.30pm. The children will visit their new classroom and meet with their new classmates, while parents attend a workshop with myself and Mrs Wallis. There will be 1 further induction day for the children and parents on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> 1.30pm – 2.30pm

#### **PIERCINGS**



Although it is common practice for cosmetic piercers to advise that jewellery must remain in the body for a number of weeks due to the healing process Education Services guidance remains the same in that to participate fully in PE activities all piercings must be removed.

Education Services safety message:
"2.7 Personal effects (e.g. jewellery, body piercings, watches, hair slides and belts constitute a hazard and may cause injury to themselves or others if worn whilst participating in Physical Education and must be removed - this list is not exhaustive and staff should assess as appropriate". In the case of parents suggesting they write a letter as a legal waiver, the authority cannot accept this as we have a 'duty of care' to pupils and as the responsible person would be liable if there was an accident or injury irrespective of a letter.

The summer break is a preferred time for piercings as it will allow sufficient time for any healing to take place.

Once pupils return to school in August the expectation will be that jewellery will be removed in order for pupils to participate in physical exercise programmes.

Although all classes have 2 allocated gym times per week these can change to accommodate visiting coaches and can lead to confusion. Pupils are encouraged to bring their PE kits on a Monday and take them home on a Friday.

Pupils with no gym kit or change of shoes will be unable to participate in these sessions.

Please ensure that your child has their kit with them.

## SUN PROTECTION & HOT WEATHER

You may send your child to school with sun-screen. Please note, staff members are not permitted to apply this, however can supervise application by children to themselves. If you wish your child to use sun screen in school, please ensure a member of staff is alerted to this in writing.

Please send your child to school with a filled re-useable water bottle.
