<p style="margin: 0;">Onomatopoeia Crash! Splash! Boom! Pop! Bam! Snap! Honk! Buzz! Drip! Swish! Ring! Crackle!</p>	<p style="margin: 0;">Alliteration Evil eagles eat eels. Dreary, dismal darkness. Pretty purple purses. Adjectives and adverbs.</p>
<p style="margin: 0;">Simile Pure as snow. Quiet as a mouse. Busy as a bee. Cute as a kitten.</p>	<p style="margin: 0;">Idiom Time flies. Cat got your tongue. Broken heart. Face the music.</p>
<p style="margin: 0;">Hyperbole For the millionth time, be quiet! He's got a brain the size of a pea. These shoes are killing me. Speed up- a snail can go faster than you!</p>
