Rhyme e.g. How do dreams know when to creep, into my head when I fall off to sleep.	Where the writer writes about something as if it were really something else.
Onomatopoeia e.g. BANG!	When a word sounds like the noise it is describing.
Repetition e.g. If I had wings. If I had wings.	Based on the number of syllables in a line which make the poem flow.
Rhythm e.g. slow to match the sun slowly rising e.g. quick to match the speed of the waves crashing on the rocks	When you say that something (a person or place, animal or thing) is like something else, using the words 'as' or 'like'.
Adjectives e.g. Glistening	Words to describe a noun (person, place or thing).
