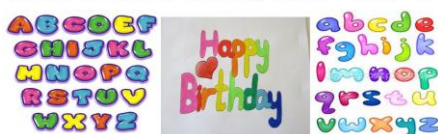
Spelling Words for Week beginning 25th January 2021.

Spelling Activity:

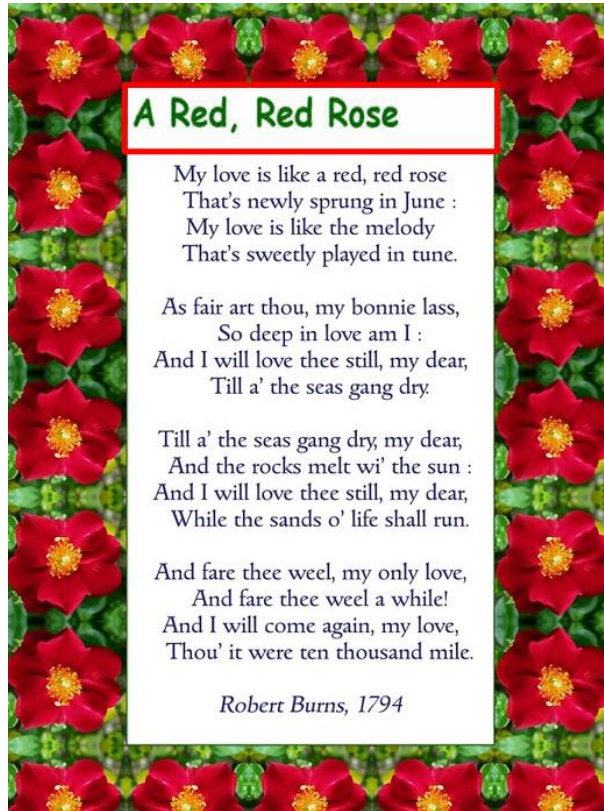
Bubble Letters

L1- I am learning to recite a poem.



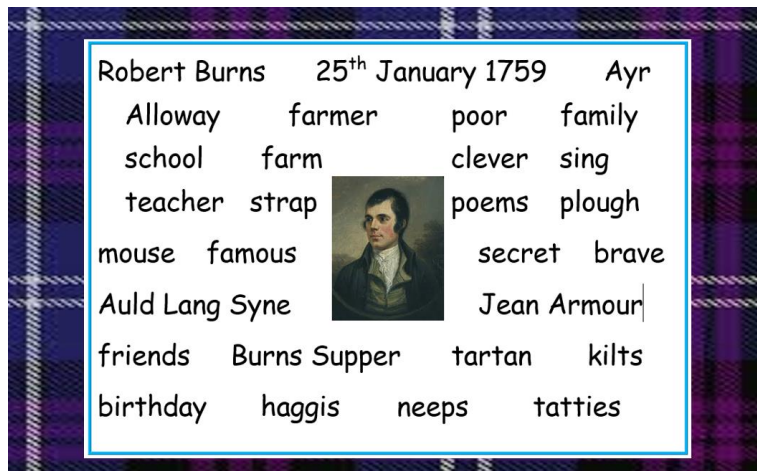

Expressive Arts

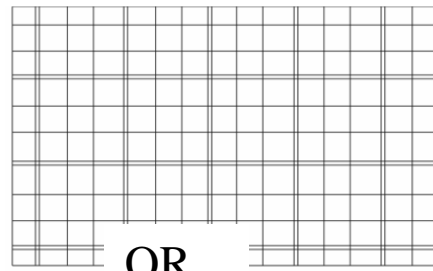
Today, we are designing our very own Tartan.

There are so many designs and colours online to check before creating your very own.

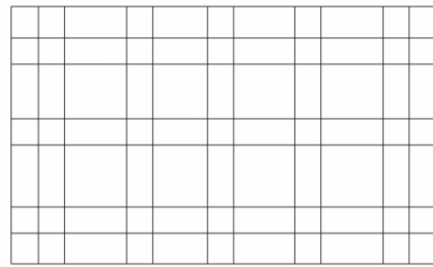


The choice is yours – You can draw a tartan kilt being worn or a tartan piece.
