

## **Literacy:**

#### **Word Families**

Today we are going to be learning about words from the 'eg' word family. Words in the eg word family all end in eg.

Look at the pictures below and have a go at sounding out and writing each word. Remember they will all end in eg.

#### **Handwriting**

It is really important that we practise the correct letter formation and orientation. Today we are going to focus on another of our 'curly caterpillar' letters the letter 'f'.

Remember, to write this letter, we start at the top, go round and straight down and hook the other way.

Can you have a go at writing this in the air with your finger first, just like we do in class. ©

Last week we started learning our number bonds facts. Today we will be doing the story of 8 and looking at all the ways you can make 8. For this activity you will need two plates and 8 objects which you can use to help you count, such as toy cars, pasta, small toys etc. Share your 8 objects between the two plates to make different number sentences for 8. For example, 5 cars on one plate and 3 on the other would mean 5+3=8.Use the template below to show all the ways you can make 8.
