
Literacy:

Come over to Seesaw and do the **en** family activity where you will hear me explain more about this.


Handwriting

It is really important that we practise the correct letter formation and orientation. Today we are going to focus on the first of our 'long ladder letters', the letter l.

To write this letter **we start at the top, go straight down to the line then flick.**

Can you have a go at writing this in the air with your finger first, just like we do in class. 😊



Caterpillar Odd and Even Numbers




Even numbers end in 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8.



Odd numbers end in 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9.


On this caterpillar, colour the even numbers **green** and the odd numbers **blue**.





On this caterpillar, fill in the **odd** numbers.




Pancake Day!

Can you and someone in your house make some pancakes today! You can follow the recipe below; we can't wait to see your delicious pancakes. The recipe says to top with lemon and sugar but you can top with anything you fancy! Miss Hughes and Mrs Lidstone will also be making pancakes today and we will share our pictures on Seesaw.



Pancake Recipe



Ingredients

100g plain flour
300ml milk
2 eggs
1tbsp caster sugar
Lemon juice

Equipment

Sifter
Large mixing bowl
Kitchen scales
Measuring jug
Measuring spoons
Wooden spoon
Frypan
Spatula
Stove


Method

1. Sift the flour into the mixing bowl.
2. Crack the eggs into the bowl.
3. Pour the milk into the bowl.
4. Stir vigorously until smooth.
5. Pour a spoonful of the mixture into a hot frypan (you may want to use oil).
6. Turn the pancake when the bubbles begin to pop.
7. Serve sprinkled with lemon juice and sugar.
