## Grammar – Exclamation Marks? *Direct Teaching on Seesaw*

Today we are going to be learning about how to use exclamation marks. An exclamation mark is a punctuation mark that is used at the end of a sentence when something is surprising or forceful. It helps to make the meaning of the sentence clear.

### Here are some examples:

1. "What a beautiful day it is today!" exclaimed the lady.
2. "Help me!" yelled the boy.

**Exclamation Marks**

Exclamation marks are used to indicate strong feelings or a raised voice in speech:

<p>"Go away!" she shouted at him.</p>	<p>"Help!"</p>	<p>"Good heavens!" he said. "Is that true?"</p>
<p>"What a beautiful smile you have!" exclaimed the dentist.</p>	<p>"Be quiet!"</p>	<p>"What a fantastic house you have!" he exclaimed.</p>

Exclamation marks are also used at the end of exclamation sentences, which start with 'what' or 'who' and contain a verb.

Avoid using exclamation marks too much or they will lose their impact.

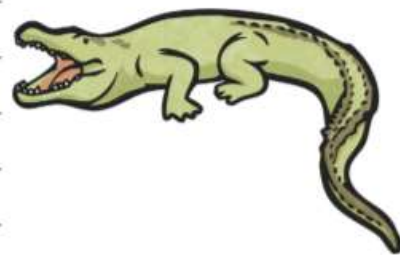
