Today we are going to be learning about how to use exclamation marks. An exclamation mark is a punctuation mark that is used at the end of a sentence when something is surprising or forceful. It helps to make the meaning of the sentence clear.

Exclamation Marks

Exclamation marks are used to indicate strong feelings or a raised voice in speech:

"Help!"

"Be quiet!"

Here are some examples:

- 1. "What a beautiful day it is today!" exclaimed the lady.
- 2. "Help me!" yelled the boy.

"Go away!" she

shouted at him.

"What a beautiful smile you have!

exclaimed the

dentist.
