Writing: Poetry

We are moving on to the new genre of writing, poetry. Poetry is a piece of writing that uses imaginative words to share ideas, emotions or a story to the reader. Many poems have words or phrases that sound good together when they are read aloud. Most poems for children rhyme e.g.

Jack and Jill

Went up the hill

To fetch a pail of <mark>water</mark>

Jack fell down

And broke his crown

And Jill came tumbling after

However, not all poems have to rhyme.

Today, we are going to be using our similes that we learned about last week and write a Simile poem all about ourselves. Remember that a simile is when you compare two things using the words 'like' or 'as' e.g.

- She was as busy as a bee.
- He was as <mark>strong</mark> l<mark>ike</mark> an <mark>ox.</mark>
- They were as quiet as mice.



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

Using the simile poem and the information above, write your own All About Me simile poem.

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

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


