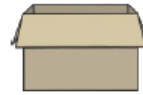

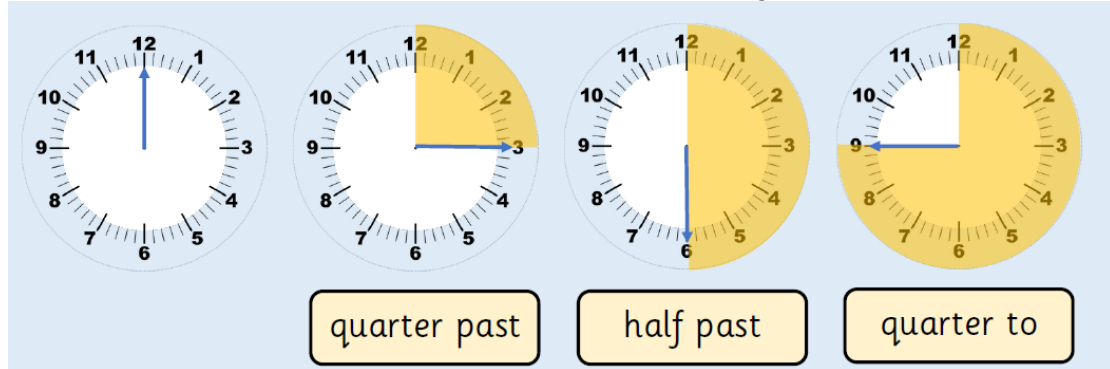

Numeracy: Time: Quarter Past & Quarter To

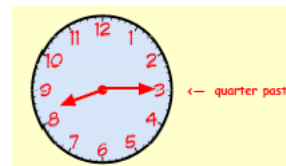
Look at the clocks. How has the minute hand (long hand) travelled?



It has moved a quarter turn each time.

When the **BIG** hand is at **3** the time reads, quarter past the hour.

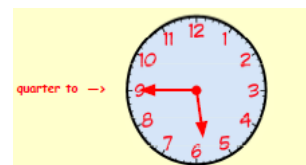
This clock reads **quarter past 8**.



Notice the hour hand (short hand) is just quarter of the way from 8 to 9.

When the **BIG** hand is at **9** the time reads, quarter past the hour.

This clock reads **quarter to 6**.


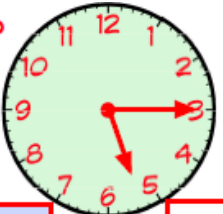
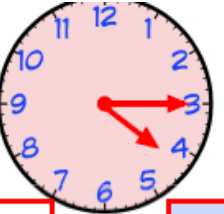
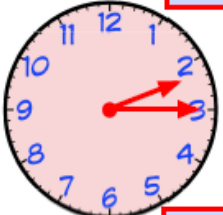
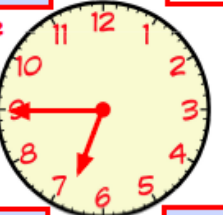
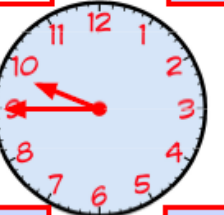
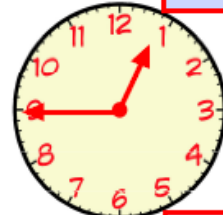
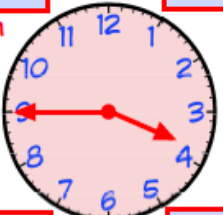
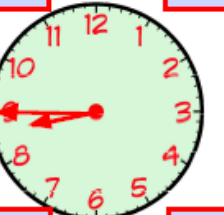





Notice the hour hand (short hand) is three quarters of the way from 5 to 6. This is always the trickiest part of telling time. So just remember, when the minute hand points to 9, we say quarter to the hour that is coming up, not the hour that is currently.

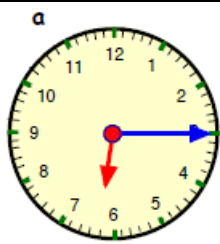
