


“Have we any word from John yet?” I asked after a long silence. Again he sighed.

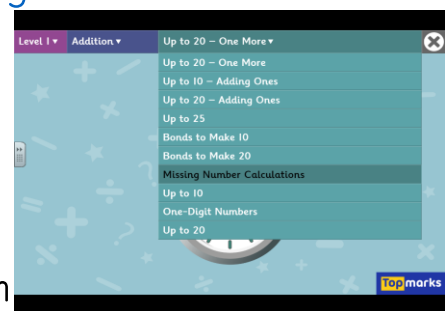
