I am as friendly as a puppy!

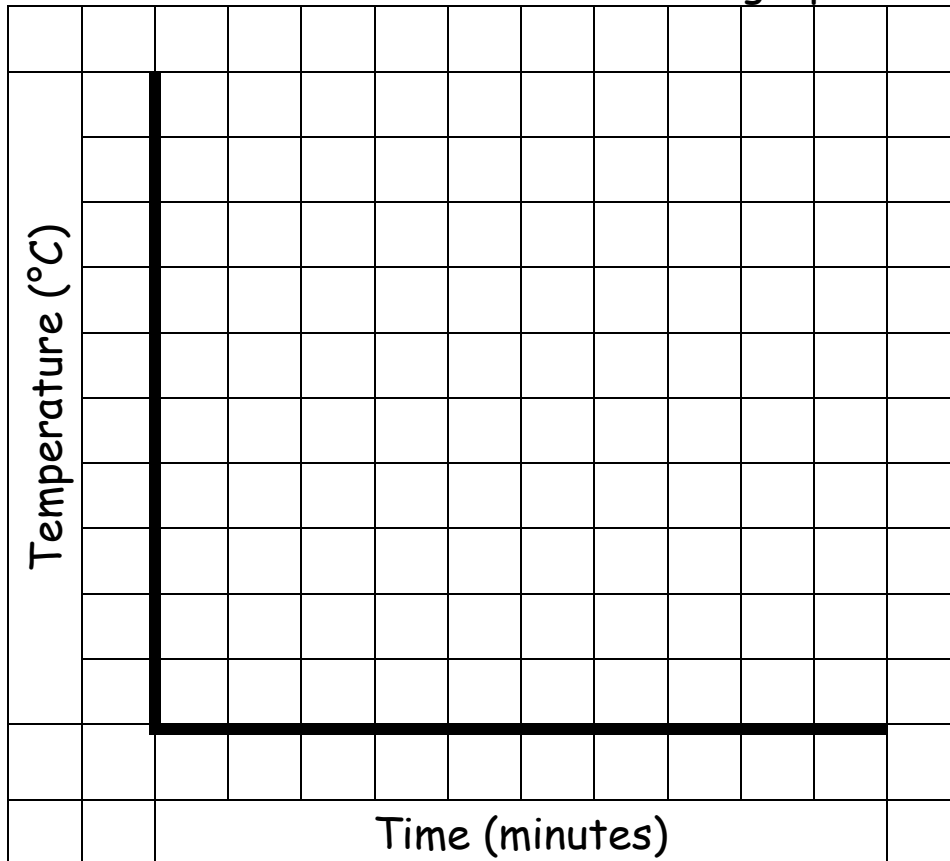
Draw a picture of yourself and what you have described.


Numeracy: Data Handling
