A mosque is more than just a place of prayer. It's a social gathering. It's a place for helping out the poor, the elderly, for holding weekend school for the kids.


The main features of a Mosque


- Minaret is very tall, has a balcony.
- Mihrab is a semicircular position in the wall of a mosque that indicates
 the qibla (the direction of the Kaaba in Mecca) and shows the direction
 that Muslims should face when praying.

- Call to prayer on a Friday (Adhan). Muslims pray 5 times a day dawn,
 mid-day, afternoon, after sunset, evening.
- Most mosques have one or more domes, (qubba). A dome is not a
 requirement like the mihrab, but is a as a symbolic representation of the
 vault of heaven.
- Ablution fountain is where Muslims wash before they pray. Prayer and cleanliness are very important to Muslims.
- Sahn is the open courtyard where Muslims meet without disturbing others.
