40 children were present when the survey was undertaken.

Miss Grant presented the results of the survey in the following table:

| PIZZA TYPE | TALLY | TOTAL NUMBER |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| Pepperoni | W | 10 |
| Cheese | W W | 20 |
| Ham and Pineapple |  | 5 |
| Chicken | W | 5 |

Plot this information in a pie chart. Remember to create a key so that I know which colour in the pie chart represents which pizza type. Think about your fractions of 40 - this will help you to work out how big each section should be! You may wish to use the template below.
