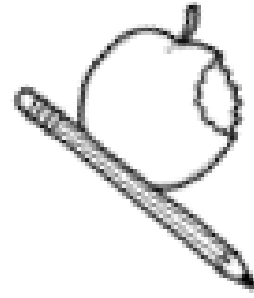

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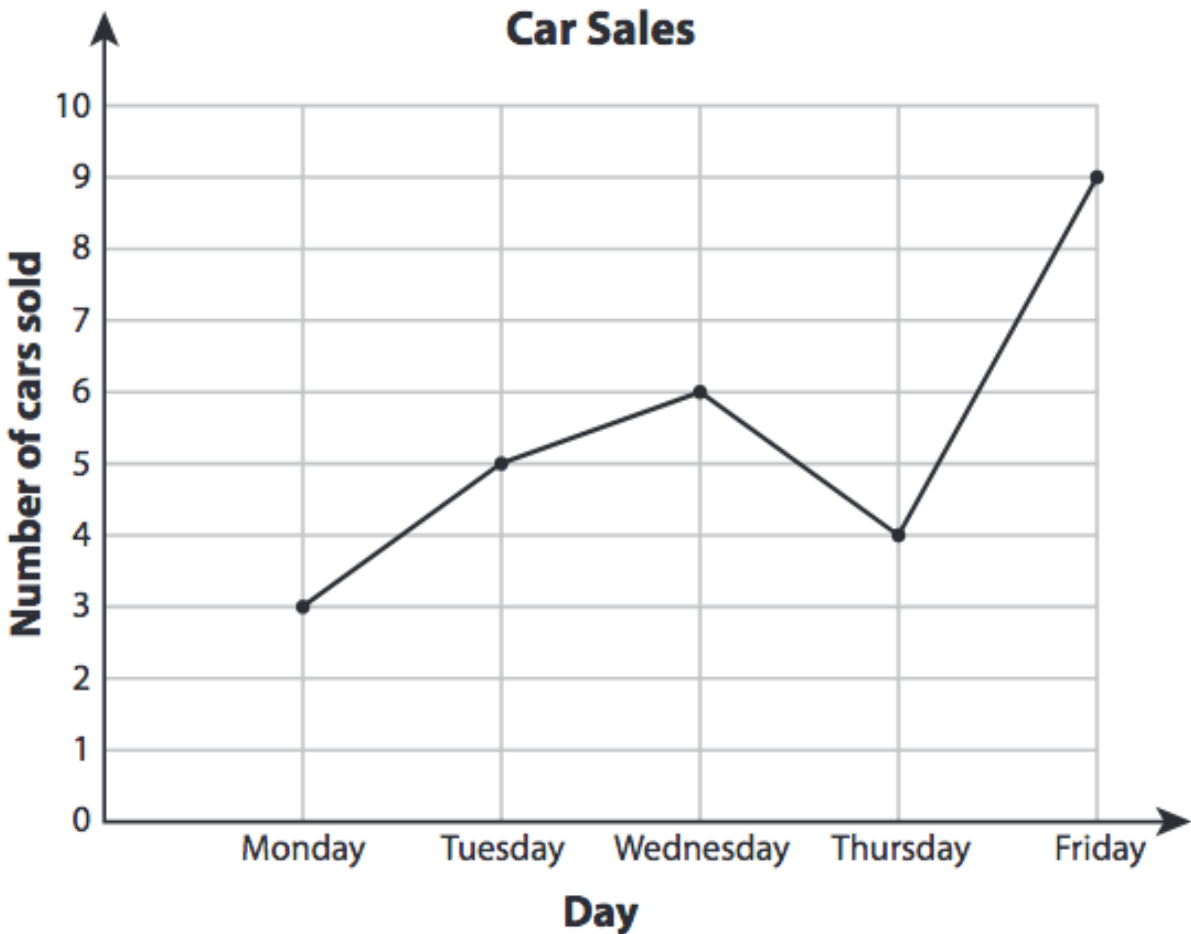

Draw a Line Graph that represents the following information:

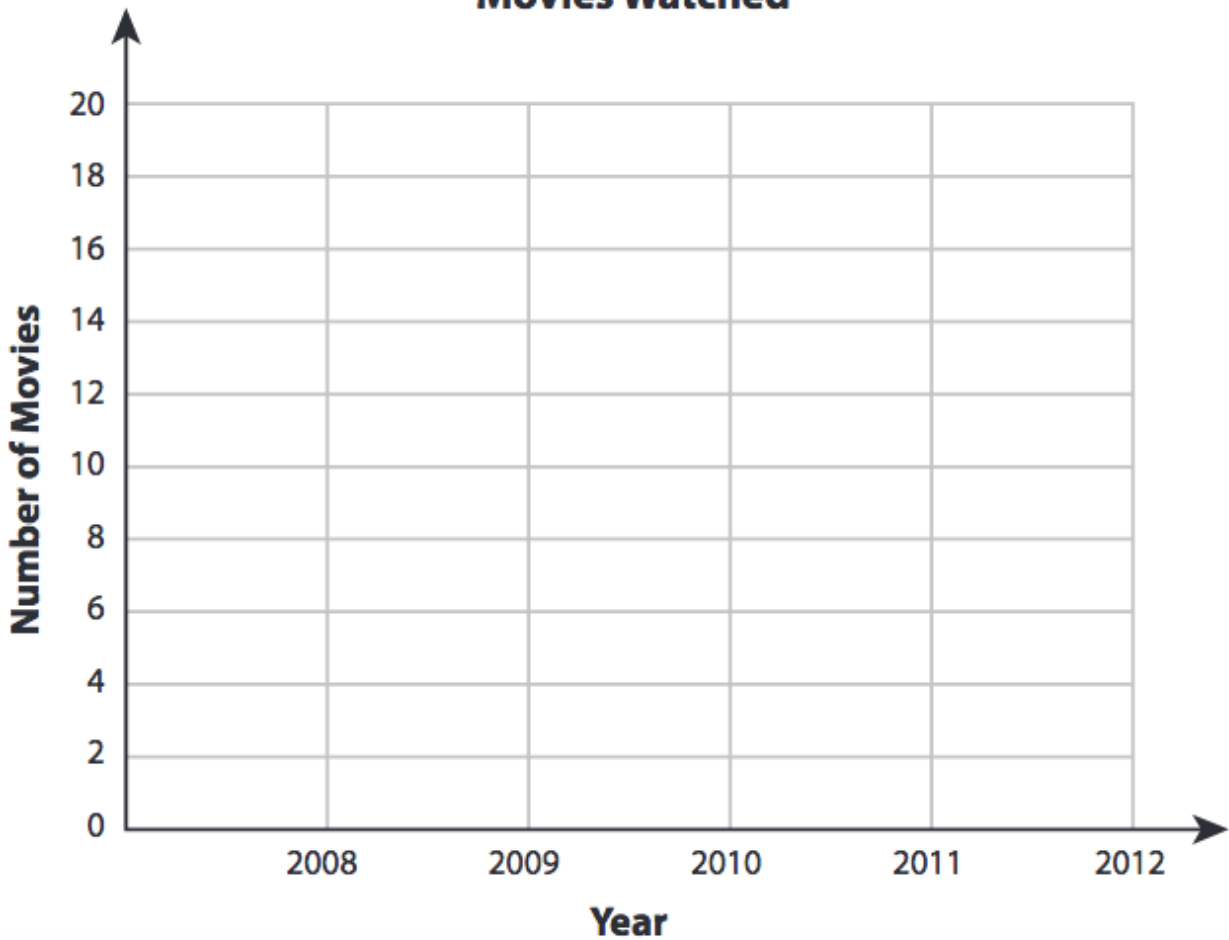
Kim and his family often watch movies at home. The data shows the number of movies watched by them from 2008 to 2012. Draw a line graph to represent the data.

## Before Reading

- Look at the front cover. What can you see?
- What do you think the book may be about?
- Who do you think will be in the story?
- Look at the title. What is a 'wee lassie'?
- What is a midgie? Have you seen or heard of one before?
- What is the 'wee lassie' wearing? Have you seen anything like this before?



## During Reading

- What does the wee lassie look like?
- When she swallowed the midgie, what did it look and feel like?
- What is a trout and where might they live?
- A Scottie is a breed of dog. Can you think of any other breeds of dogs?
- Look at the illustrations on the pages on the right hand side. What do you think they are?
- Look at the cow. Have you ever seen one of these before? Where?
- She swallowed Nessie. Who or what is Nessie?
- After she swallowed Nessie, she swallowed a loch. What is a loch? Have you ever been to one?
- How do you think the animals would feel when they were swallowed?
- If you could pick one animal to be your favourite, which would it be and why?
- What is your favourite Scots word from the book? Why is it your favourite? Have you ever used it before?



## After Reading

- Did you enjoy the story?
- What was your favourite part of the story and why?
- Have you ever read or watched something similar before?
- Do you think the wee lassie made the right decision to swallow all of the animals?
- Can you think of any Scots words to describe any of the things she swallowed?
