LITERACY



Reading - P4 will develop their reading skills through reading books, their own independent reading and a class novel. Children should practise reading fluently and with expression. We will build on reading comprehension strategies and learn how to answer literal, inferential and evaluative style questions.

Listening and Talking - We are exploring finding and using information and understanding, analysing and evaluating for talking and listening. Children will develop listening skills when sharing news with each other, asking and answering appropriate questions and contributing to groups.

Writing - This term's writing focus' are poetry, explanation and persuasive. Children will develop their VCOP skills in writing using vocabulary, connectives, openers and different types of punctuation to up level their sentences.

Spelling - We will be continuing to work through our individualised spelling progression programmes.

Homework

Home learning will no longer be issued by class teachers. However, if you would like to support your child's learning at home, a wide range of activities are available through the school app and the school website. On the app, this information can be found in the *Classes* section, and on the website, it is located under the *Home Learning* tab. Termly spelling words and common words can be requested to be sent home.

NUMERACY



Primary 4 will develop their skills in fractions, data handling, measure (weight and volume), money and angles, symmetry and transformation. We are also revising addition, subtraction, multiplication and division knowledge from term 2.

We will be developing mental maths skills through daily practice.



H&WB: Our focus for this block is on Dealing with conflict and change, resilience, rights and responsibilities

PE: Our PE days are Tuesday and Friday. In January we will be learning Scottish Country Dancing along with developing skills in basketball and rugby. Please ensure all jewellery is removed before coming to school on these days.
