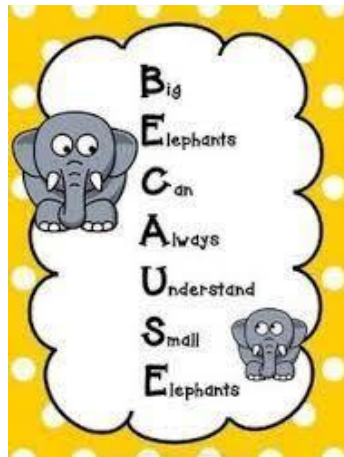
Spelling: Write words 3 times as you do in your jotters –
