Henna has existed from centuries and was usually drawn on the palms and feet. Girls get very excited for their Eid arrangements, especially for henna. They are fond of henna and often consider their Eid incomplete without it. Today, we use a henna filled cone to apply henna designs. The benefit of using a cone is that you can achieve incredibly fine lines with it. Cones are held like a pencil in your hand to apply and design.

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
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

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
