



Throughout the Seder meal, four cups of wine are drunk, as a symbol of the Jewish people's freedom.
Can you find out the symbolism of these foods?	(c) Matzet - When the Jewish people fled Egypt, as the story of Passover goes, they didn't have much time to prepare food for the long journey ahead. They were forced to leave their homes with unleavened bread, as the bread they'd been making hadn't had enough time to
