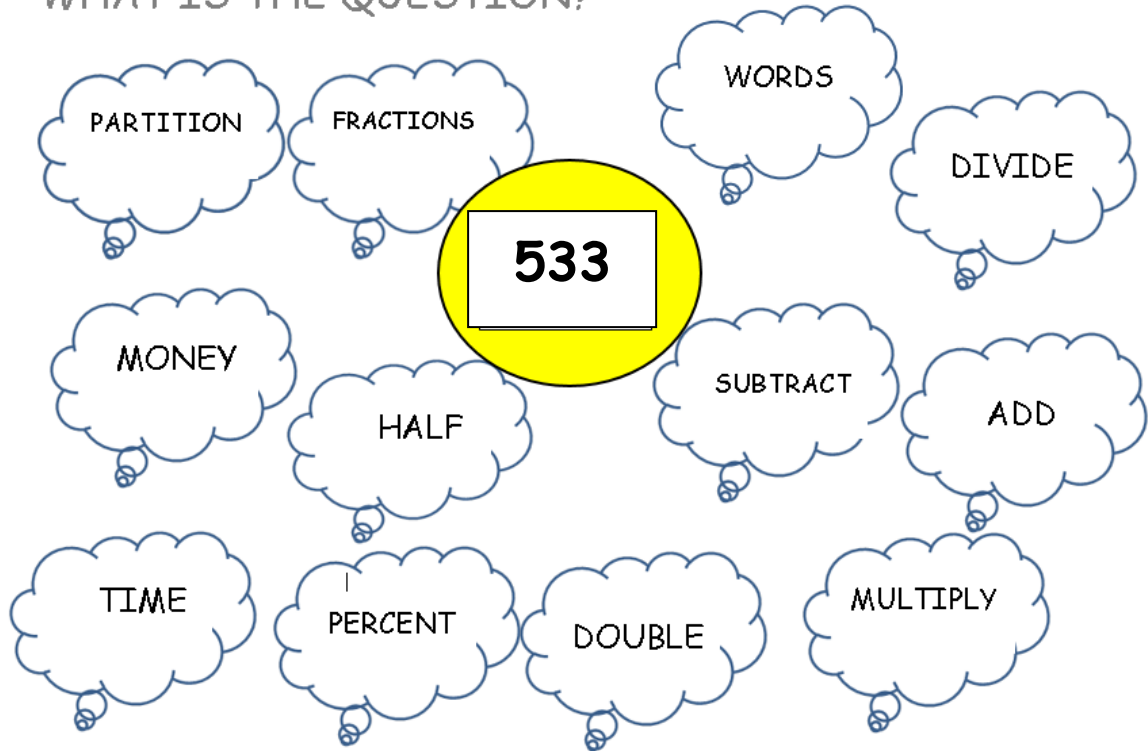

Use Google Maps or an atlas to travel around the world! Can you find a country where cocoa grows?

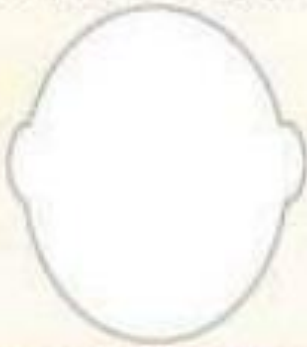
