

Numeracy - L.1 - I can create a Bar Graph.


Cubes and Cuboids

The Holocaust - I can create a poster displaying facts about
The Holocaust.

On 27 January every year, it is Holocaust Memorial Day.

It's a day for everyone to remember the millions of people who were killed, or whose lives have been changed, by an event in history called the Holocaust.

On this day we also remember the millions of people who were killed or have been affected by Nazi persecution and terrible crimes committed during conflicts in Europe, Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

The Holocaust is the name given to the genocide of Jews, gypsies, people with disabilities and other groups of people in the Second World War.

KRISTALLNACHT



The Nazis, led by Adolf Hitler, came to power in 1933 and started persecuting German Jews. In less than six years, German Jews lost all of their rights. Hitler made anti-Semitism (hatred of Jewish people) a government policy. Before the Holocaust started the Nazis gave the people a warning that Germany will be pure blooded German, the "Aryan Master Race" (Heinrich Himmler, the leader of the SS group)

"After a while, the street troupes were joined by people who were not in uniform, and suddenly, with one and all of them with the Jews," the gathering produced a mob and looted and burned. They advanced toward the little synagogues.
 The crowd tore the Holy Ark, wide open and the three men who had climbed the Ark threw the scrolls of the Law of Moses out. They threw them... on the screaming and shouting mass of people which had filled the synagogue.
 Naked and open, the scrolls lay in the muddy wetness later; children trooped on them and tore pieces from the fine parchment on which the Law was written."



"A number of men, somewhere between seven and ten, came tearing into our house and started smashing everything. My parents were screaming and shouting because they didn't know what was happening to us... it was really awful."

"I stood before the burning hall (synagogue) and watched as the flames protruded the surrounding buildings... slowly the smoke returned in a wave of anger. I clutched my hat, my eyes filled with tears of outrage."

Herschel Grynszpan (left) was 17 years old and illegally living in Paris with his uncle. He got word that his family in Germany was getting deported to Poland. He was furious about what was happening, so he bought a revolver and shot a German diplomat, Ernst vom Rath right. The Germans blamed all of the Jews, making them the scapegoats, for this through newspaper propaganda and it started Kristallnacht.



After that the Jews were required to repair the damaged buildings. If they did have insurance money it was taken away and was given to the state. They also fined the Jewish community one billion marks for the destruction. 30,000 Jews were arrested and sent to concentration camps.

The Jews had to paint the Star of David (six pointed Jewish star) on the windows of their stores and label the building with the word "Jude". This prevented pure blooded Germans from shopping at those stores. Nazi storm troopers guarded the Jewish stores so people would not want to venture inside, causing most people to boycott all Jewish stores. People also started local anti-Jew riots in smaller towns.

- Sad Facts:**
- All teachers were required to be part of the Nazi Party to teach the children their Nazi thoughts.
 - The Nazis conquered France, Belgium, Holland, Czechoslovakia, and other European countries taking as many Jewish people as possible.
 - The Jews were sent to Dachau, Buchenwald, and Sachsenhausen concentration camps and worked, starved, tortured, and killed.
 - Britain offered to take 10,000 children from Germany, Austria, and Czechoslovakia, separating them from their families forever.

Glossary
 boycott—to stop using products as a form of protesting
 goteppes—(Gefessene Staatspolizei) secret police using terrible methods against a group of people
 Kristallnacht—the night when the Nazis broke the windows of the Jewish buildings around Germany
 propaganda—ideas that are often not true that are spread in order to help a cause whether good or bad
 scapegoat—someone that takes the blame for what someone else does.
 SS—(Schutzstaffel or "Protection Squads") They were the most racist group of the Nazi party which carried out most of the killing during the holocaust.
