We will also focus on answering literal, inferential and exclusitive quantions to show our understanding of what we have read. Furthermore, we will be identifying facts, opinions and bias and will be evaluating the reliability of sources. We will be indexlying newlal inform with our World War tepts.

Listening and Talking - This block we will have the opportunity to prepare and present a Youse Captain speach. We will also be developing our ability to listen and interpret information by watching and reading non-flation texts.

Whiting - This termis focuses are recount, report and persuadive writing. We will be challenging everyone to use a range of VCD follow and onlying features of these types of non-faction teats. There will be weekly spelling words with activities and the use of the joined-up script is encouraged of all times.

French - We will be developing our convenientional French skills including numbers, greatings and birthdays,

NUMERACY



In Numeracy we will be learning how to read, write, order and round up to 8-digit numbers with 3 decimal places. We will be focusting on addition strategies and enswering multi-step problems.

We will be continually revising our times tables and using these to multiple and divide.

We will be looking at measuring time using different units, solving problems with money using different operations and creating nets of 3D and drawing triangles.

Hegith & Wellbeing: This month we will focusion the School Values and will also be looking at Emotions.
As part of this topic we will identify emotions, look at triggers and sthategies for coping with our emotions.
