Why do people have parties?

Here are some times when people like to celebrate together.

Birthday party

Birthdays are often celebrated with gifts, decorations. balloons, cakes and the song 'Happy Birthday to You!'





Garden party

These might take part in parks or gardens. They may include picnics or barbecues.



Surprise party

These parties are held to celebrate a person's birthday, anniversary or achievement. However, the person doesn't know about the party beforehand.



Dance party Guests enjoy dancing together. These celebrations can be casual or formal.



Fancy dress party At these events, people can wear masks and costumes. They may be held to celebrate special events like Halloween and Mardi Gras.

Fundraising party These parties are held to raise money for a person, school, charity or business. Guests might pay

to attend.





Some parties take place on special days, like Christmas, New Year's Eve, Thanksgiving and Diwali. Can you think of any other examples?

When you are preparing your party, here are some things that you might need to think about.

Why are you having a party?	When will it take place?		
Where will it be held?	How much money do you have to spend on the venue, food and entertainment?		
Who will you invite? What should they wear? Will they need to bring anything?	How will people find out about the party? You may need to send out invitations!		
What will people do at the party? Will they listen to music, dance or play games?	Will you be offering food and drinks to your guests? What is on the menu?		
Will you be decorating the venue? Will you need flowers, balloons or banners?	Who will help you to plan the party, run the event and clean up afterwards?
